CHAPTER ELEVEN

ARTICLE I - Public Solicitations

- 11.1.1 "Public Solicitation" Defined The term, "Public Solicitation," as used in this Chapter shall mean the act of soliciting, requesting, or seeking to obtain from members of the public generally, or from any substantial number or group of the public, in the Town of Glasgow of money, goods, or services, whether such act is performed at a fixed place, from door to door, or in the public streets, ways, or buildings of the Town and whether conducted in person, by mail, through the distribution of printed material, or by other means.
- 11.1.2 Permit A written permit authorizing the conducting of a public solicitation in the Town may be issued by the Mayor or by the Chief of Police upon written application by the person or organization desiring to conduct the same, which application shall contain such relevant information as the Mayor or Chief of Police, as the case may be, with whom the application is filed shall direct. No fee shall be required for such a permit. If the Mayor or Chief of Police, as the case may be, with whom the application is filed or by whom it is being considered concludes, after reasonable consideration of the relevant factors involved, that the conducting of the proposed solicitation is not in the best interests of the Town or is likely to be detrimental to the public or to a substantial segment thereof, he may decline to issue the permit or may issue it in a form different from the original application.
- 11.1.3 <u>Permit Required for Public Solicitation</u> Except as otherwise provided in Section 11.1.4 of this Chapter, it shall be unlawful for any person, either on

his own behalf or on behalf of any firm, corporation, or organization, to conduct a public solicitation in the Town except in pursuance of, and strictly in accordance with the terms of, a permit issued under the provisions of Section 11.1.2 of this Chapter.

11.1.4 <u>Exemption</u> – The requirements of Section 11.1.2 and 11.1.3 of this Chapter shall not be applicable to a public solicitation conducted by a church whose place of worship is located in the Town or by an organization within, and affiliated with, such church.
